OVERVIEW


With members spread amongst the Auskick, junior and senior sides at Kalamunda, the need was identified to complete an upgrade of the Pat Moran Pavilion. The aim of this project was to support the provision of gender equitable facilities catering to a diverse range of participants at Kalamunda and Districts lunior Football Club.

This project saw the redevelopment of four player change facilities along with upgrading the umpire change facilities to achieve gender neutral outcomes. This included the creation of lockable shower cubicles and an upgrade to the aging toilet facilities. Increased storage was also created for each change room, in addition to new gender neutral, all-access toilet facilities for public use.

This project, supported through the WA Football Facilities fund and City of Kalamunda, assists the already large and growing participation base at Kalamunda and Districts Junior Football Club, by providing brand new, well positioned, welcoming, accessible, fit for purpose football facilities.

Project Outcomes

- New gender neutral change facilities that support both the current participation and future growth of women and girls playing Australian Football in the region
- Creates a more welcoming and accessible environment for both members and spectators
- Change room upgrades align with the objectives of the WA Football Facilities Strategy 2020 - 2030, prioritising the upgrade and conversion of player and umpire changerooms
