OVERVIEW

Funding was contributed to the Cadbury Sports Ground project through the Australian Football Facilities Fund (AFFF), in conjunction with the Tasmanian State Government and the Glenorchy City Council, to support the development of equitable changerooms for the Claremont Junior Football Club. This project is an example of how multiple stakeholders can come together to create beneficial outcomes for local football clubs and the surrounding community.

The refurbishment of the change room facilities at the Cadbury Sports Ground Oval caters for use by all genders and includes an accessible toilet, new toilet and shower cubicles, vinyl flooring, mechanical ventilation, fittings, and fixtures. The ongoing benefit of the upgrade provides equitable change rooms with the removal of men's urinals and installation of partition showers for privacy.

This project provides a key example of how funding can be accessed and utilised to improve existing amenities, providing a more welcoming and accessible venue. Projects like the Cadbury Sports Ground Oval Clubroom Redevelopment are pivotal in supporting the provision of well positioned, welcoming, accessible, fit for purpose football facilities that support our growing game's strategic priorities.
