

UMPOWERED COACHING CONFERENCE

NATIONAL 2026



Background

In 2024, the inaugural UMPowered Coaching Conference was launched, bringing together self-nominated Women and Girls Umpires and Umpire Coaches from every state and territory for a landmark national event. Twenty five passionate participants were selected to attend a two-day conference at AFL House, where they engaged in immersive sessions designed to enhance their coaching skills and expand their professional toolkit.

This initiative aligns with the Women and Girls Game Development Action Plan, which places a strong emphasis on creating supportive umpiring environments and fostering long-term involvement for women and girls in the game. Central to this vision is the presence of empowered women in umpire coaching roles—leaders who inspire, mentor, and cultivate inclusive, welcoming spaces for all.

Since its inception, the UMPowered program has proudly welcomed 49 alumni, a testament to its growing influence and impact. We are now excited to announce that applications are open for the third National UMPowered Conference, offering another opportunity to be part of this transformative movement in umpiring.

The Program

PURPOSE

The UMPowered Coaching Conference is designed to identify and build the leadership skills of women & non-binary umpire coaches to start or continue their coaching journey.

Its core mission is to:

- Increase visibility and representation of women and girls in umpire coaching roles
- Create a strong network of umpire coaches across Australia to serve as a point of connection and support.
- Develop the coaching philosophies of participants and confidence in practicing strengthbased leadership.
- Upskill participants with technical umpire coaching strategies and tools.
- Provide experiences that inspire and encourage participants to continue their umpire coaching careers.

AUDIENCE

The conference is designed for women and non-binary umpire coaches and / or high potential umpires to take up coaching.

- Applicants must be over the age of 18
- Be endorsed and supported by their umpiring group to engage in the conference
- Be currently coaching or aspire to coach in the future

Program Overview

The program will begin with a two-day Conference in Melbourne on the 28th and 29th March 2026, facilitated by Carol Fox and a number of AFL Umpiring experts. The workshop will cover key themes including:

- Confident Communication Tools
- Skill Acquisition
- Developing Umpires
- Reflection & Personal Development as a Coach
- Match Day Experience
- Behind the scenes

And so much more!

Participants are required to be available for both days of the Conference and for one smaller group session that will be held throughout the year online.

Submission Criteria

It is a requirement that the participant:

- 1. Be over the age of 18
- 2. Identifies as a woman or non-binary person
- 3. Is currently coaching or has a desire to coach
- 4. Is supported by the umpire group manager to engage in the program
- 5. Is available to attend both days of the conference

How to apply

- 1. Current Women & Girls Umpires and Coaches will be sent the link directly to apply.
- 2. Umpire groups may tap girls on the shoulder and encourage them to apply
- 3. Complete the form by the 30th January 2026
